Behold the Lamb of God

Exodus 12:1-14

God has shown us through the Passover in the old testament that He will save us through the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ. The Passover was not only a holy day to remember and give thanks to God for what He did during the exodus but also an event that gave hope in the work that God will do at the cross.

1. What does the Passover commemorate? (vv. 12-13) How did the Passover signify Jesus who was to come? Have I been spared of the judgment of God, and am I living in salvation with joy and thanksgiving?
2. How did God instruct to eat the Passover meal? (vv. 8-11) Especially in v.11, what does it mean when He tells them to eat quickly, having prepared to leave? What does that tell us about how should live in this current day and age as a Christian in this world? What is the greatest impediment to my living for the Kingdom of God and not being conformed to this world?
3. God commanded to keep the Passover a memorial day as a statute forever. (v.14) He especially commands to repeatedly teach the children the meaning of the Passover. (vv. 13:8-10, 14-16). Am I putting priority on teaching my children to have faith in God? What is most needed in passing down our faith in God to our children and the next generation?

This day shall be for you a memorial day, and you shall keep it as a feast to the Lord; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast. -Exodus 12:14-
